

Competitors' Briefing

AC National Sprint Championships – Champion Lakes, WA

3rd – 7th April 2013

1	Team Leader meeting for team managers and coaches to be held on Tuesday 2nd April at 5pm (WA time) at Champion Lakes Regatta Centre.
2	All race entry changes, queries, protests and appeals must be submitted to the competition committee by your state or NCE Team Leader/Coach. 3	Entries should be finalised at the Team Leaders meeting on Tuesday. <u>Additional Entries after the meeting are not permitted.</u> Competitors may scratch entries or change team boats in Heats and Direct Finals until ONE hour before the start of racing each day. Competitors are not permitted to scratch from Semi-finals or subsequent Finals without the consent of the Chief Official. A doctor's certificate is generally required in such cases. Entry to other events after the scratching will only be considered on application to the Chief Official.
4	Long distances races entries will ONLY be accepted until midday on the day of racing.
5	Results, updated start lists, and news stories will be published on the Australian Canoeing Website www.canoe.org.au under Events/Sprint. Results and race draws are posted on the results board at the finish tower after each race. Copies of the start list will be available from the secretariat at 30mins before the first race each day. The program will cost \$1. NOTE: the State Team Leader/Manager (as per point 2) will receive a start list each day free of charge.
6	The island will be locked each night and a security person will be on site overnight. Boats, trailers and tents may be left overnight at the owner's risk. Other items should not be left at the venue.
7	Parking is not permitted on the grassed areas around the buildings. Boat trailers and all other vehicles may only park in designated areas. Parking in the car park adjacent to the clubhouse is only by permission from Champion Lakes management.
8	When setting up tents participants must be mindful of sprinkler lines which we can point out. If professional marquees (hoecker style) are in use they must be weighted above ground rather than using long spikes.
9	There will be 8 racing lanes at Champion Lakes which will be 9m wide. Starting System will be used for most races with the exception of 1000 metre races on Saturday and Sunday which will have a pontoon and boat holders.
10	Drug testing maybe carried out during the regatta by representatives from the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Agency (ASDA). Competitors are expected to cooperate fully with their requests. Any competitor unsure of his/her obligations should seek clarification from the Chief Official. For further information, please check the ASDA website at http://www.asada.gov.au/index.html .

11	It is highly recommended to bring sunscreen and lots of fluids, as the weather could be very hot and windy. Shade is very limited so teams should supply their own shelter.
12	Competitors must wear an officially recognised Club, State or NCE uniform. International visitors competing must wear their ICF affiliated country or club uniform.
13	All competitors in 12 Year age groups must wear approved personal flotation devices in all races. Team Leaders and coaches should ensure that these are available.
14	Cycling is not permitted on the eastern (island side) of the course. Riding in front of the clubhouse and team/spectator areas is prohibited for reasons of safety. The cycling path on the western side of the course is for cyclists following the races. Cyclists are not permitted on the adjacent road which is for Sports Science and emergency use only. Persons riding along the eastern side the course must wear a bicycle helmet in accordance with WA law. Driving on the western side of the course is prohibited without permission of the Competition committee. Any breach of these requirements may result in the disqualification of any competitor or crew concerned.
15	This event is being conducted under the Australian Canoeing Sprint Racing Competition Rules. The ICF Sprint Racing Competition Rules (2013) therefore apply as modified by the Australian Rules and this document. The event is also conducted under the bylaws of Australian Canoeing.
16	It is the competitors' responsibility to know the rules of the competition. Any competitor who is unsure of any detail, or has a problem concerning the running of the championships should seek clarification via their Team Leader from the Chief Official.
17	Competitors wishing to protest on the result of an event must lodge their protest via their State/Team Manager to the Chief Official within 20 minutes of the completion of that event. The protest must be in writing and accompanied by a \$50.00 protest fee .
18	Coaching or otherwise assisting from the side of the course is not permitted.
19	A competitor who arrives too late at the start or who otherwise does not start, and has no valid reason approved by the Chief Official, shall be disqualified from the race in question. Upon payment of the prescribed reinstatement fee the competitor may continue to participate in those other races of the regatta in which the competitor is entered, but otherwise shall be disqualified for the remainder of the regatta. Where a competitor is disqualified under this rule and has no other races remaining in the regatta, the competitor shall not be allowed to enter the next national competition unless the prescribed reinstatement fee has been paid. The reinstatement fee is \$100 for seniors and \$25 for juniors and veterans.
20	In races up to 1000 metres, competitors must keep the whole of their boat within the 4m wide central area of their lane from the start to the finish of the course. Upon any deviation, the boat must go back immediately to this central area. No boat may come nearer than five metres in any direction to the boat of another competitor.
21	Competitors' attention is drawn to the ruling on false starts. Any competitor who makes a second false start will be disqualified from the race. The decision of the starter will be final.
22	Competitors are not permitted to paddle alongside a race in progress. Receiving external assistance is not permitted and puts the competitor at risk of disqualification.
23	Competitors in the vicinity of the course should stop their boat while a race is in progress nearby, to ensure minimum interference to those racing. This is particularly relevant when paddling on the course to get to the start line and when exiting the warm-up lake Champion Lakes.

24	It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure that their boats meet the construction requirements of the ICF rules. Facilities are provided for competitors to check the weight of their boats. The organising committee has lead sheet available for sale for this purpose. It must be paid for in cash - no IOU's will be accepted. The price of the lead is based on materials cost recovery only.
25	All races may be subject to Boat Control after the finish. If your lane number is called you must exit the water at the post boat control chute at the designated area in the warm-up lake and proceed through the marked transit area to boat control. Only approved Sports Science personnel, AC officials, approved photographers and ASDA officials are permitted in the marked areas. Scales will be available for checking prior to racing. Permission to enter the area is granted by the Chief Official.
26	Competitors must not paddle in close proximity to the starting area while a race is in the process of being started.
27	Competitors should not congregate in their boats in the vicinity of the finishing line in case they interfere with the judging or the finish of the event in progress.
28	In races up to 1000 metres, competitors must keep the whole of their boat within the 4m wide central area of their lane from the start to the finish of the course. Upon any deviation, the boat must go back immediately to this central area. No boat may come nearer than five metres in any direction to the boat of another competitor.
29	Any competitor who displays behaviour detrimental to the good order and conduct of the competition may be disciplined or disqualified. An athlete or crew which in the opinion of the Competition Committee deliberately does not compete to their ability in a race, to affect their progression in an event or otherwise, may be disqualified from the event or from the remainder of the regatta. A competitor who acts in a manner unbecoming of a member of Australian Canoeing or brings Australian Canoeing or the sport of canoeing into disrepute may be subject to disciplinary proceedings.
30	Please remember that all officials and helpers are working as volunteers at the Championships. Please treat them with respect and courtesy.
31	In cases where boats need to be changed over quickly, permission must be sought from the chief official to paddle up the course.
32	All events are on time. Unless otherwise announced of a significant delay. Please be prepared to start your race at the published time.
33	Please refer to the venue map as to where you can set up your shade.
34	<p>MEDAL PRESENTATION PROTOCOL - AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS 2013</p> <p>Australian Championship medals will be presented according to the AC Awards by-law. Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be presented to the first 3 placegetters where 4 or more athletes finish in an A Final.</p> <p>Due to the large number of finals at Australian Championships, medals will only be presented on the dais for the Open and 18 years events for men and women.</p> <p>However, in recognition of junior and masters athletes, the dais will be made available for photo opportunities at the end of the days racing. If required an AC / ICF Official will be available for the photo if requested.</p> <p>All remaining medals for other events will be available for collection at the conclusion of the day racing – NOT BEFORE.</p>

Any competition paddlers that are not members of an affiliated club of Australian Canoeing are required to compete in either a white T-shirt or white racing singlet to meet the intent of club uniform requirements for competition, and in the circumstance that they wish to wear a lycra or similar material paddling suit in competition, they are to wear a white singlet / T-shirt over such suit, such that any branding or advertising that may be on the suit is not visible in respect of a viewing audience, be it by filming, videography and / or by spectator and / or officials at the venue.
